



### ...and a wonderful idea: inexhaustability of the oceans...


Thomas Huxley viewed these fisheries as one of unending surplus. "... that the cod fishery, the herring fishery, the pilchard fishery, the mackerel fishery, and probably all the great sea fisheries, are inexhaustible; that is to say that nothing we do seriously affects the number of fish. And any attempt to regulate these fisheries seems consequently... to be useless" (Huxley 1884).







### Many types of rights-based systems...


- Not a question of rights or no rights
- Question of nature and strength of right
  - -groups or individuals
  - Balance between economically efficient and socially acceptable

### Why has the adoption of fishing rights been so slow?



#### Privatization is NOT necessary

- Myriad of rights-based systems
  - each with pros and cons
- Many different forms of rights
  - catch shares / limited access privilege programs/designated access programs
  - customary tenure systems
  - territorial user rights
  - group user rights, not just
  - individual transferable quotas (ITQs)
- Initial allocations politically sensitive

#### Contemporary thinking on rightsbased systems...

- The State gives long-term tenure
  - constraining efficiency for social acceptability
- Presumption of renewal but no guarantee
  - links to performance criteria
- State retains clear rights to the resources


