- How are international resource dynamics around energy or food currently being reflected or translated in emergency or humanitarian settings?
- How can international finance and/or policy mechanisms be reimagined and or reinvigorated to better address climate, energy, natural resource, and environmental issues in humanitarian settings?
- How are migration issues integrated in nationally determined contributions? And what might be some of the future models to better integrate displaced people into national climate targets?
- How do local political economies and black markets and war economies play a role in resource conflicts in and around humanitarian settings?
- To what extent are refugees and displaced people included in sustainable energy policy and progress towards SDG 7 on sustainable energy and SDG 13 on climate action? Are displaced people meaningfully included in policy debates and energy programme design?
